Pocket money



You will get paid pocket money by your carer, how much you get depends on your age and is on our website www.haltoncicc.co.uk. There are tips in this leaflet on how to save your pocket money for things you may want to buy.

Clothing allowance



Your carer has money to buy your clothes and can get the things that you need. You can ask your Social Worker or carer how much you can have.

There is additional money to buy your first school uniform for primary school and your first school uniform for secondary school.

Birthday/Christmas allowances



Your carer receives money for your birthday, which can be used to buy you gifts.

What am I entitled to?



Your carer or social worker can tell you how much you are allowed.

You can also ask your Support Worker or Independent Reviewing Manager.

If you have an Advocate from NYAS, they can also let you know.
